Challenges

- Began FY18 budget with a \$1.1M base reduction and \$774K use of reserves
- Continue Hiring Review process and pullback of vacancy savings
- Continued reductions over past 5 years
- Limited resources for investments

Opportunities

Shared Services

The Academic Affairs Fiscal Shared Service Center began with a pilot effort in FY16 and now the total savings amounts to about \$1.3M recurring funds. Below is the breakdown of the units involved and the amounts each units has saved. Based on the feedback I have received through surveying each unit, the overall feedback has been positive, and other efficiencies have been gained through analysis around curricular planning, workforce mix of both staff and faculty, and streamlining operating processes.

Shared Services does not have to just be limited to fiscal operations. I have engaged with Communications and Marketing Web Services and Human Resources to look at opportunities of collaboration with units that use fiscal shared services. These units would be a great starting point for additional shared service opportunities since these units believe in the shared service model and understand the benefits of shared services.

Managed Online Programs (MOPs)

The following units have signed MOPs agreements and have either implemented their online program or are in the process of implementation. Each unit received a \$100,000 subsidy for implementation and will receive 65% of the net tuition generated from their program. Resources have been set aside to continue the development of these online opportunities.

Global and National Security Policy Institute (GNSPI)

The Global and National Security Policy Institute (GNSPI) is in the process of getting final approval from the Faculty Senate and State for its graduate degree program. The planned official launch of the degree is not anticipated until Fall 2018, courses have been launch in both Fall 2016 with 2 enrollments and Spring 2017 with 7 enrollments. Additional course will be taught this academic year, and all course

development should be completed in Spring 2018. Currently, GNSPI has been working on a business plan requested by the external board, which will be used to generate collaborations between the national labs, governmental and private entities. At this time GNSPI has a commitment of \$150,000 (\$50K for 3 years) from Los Alamos National Labs.
