The Usefulness of Uselessness: One of our faculty colleagues told me last week about <u>an article</u> that was sent to her daughter by Tufts University. The article states, "It is often repeated that you need a college education to get a decent job. This is true. No one denies it. But it is not true that the mission of the college is therefore to prepare young people for a career. Colleges do that anyway but a lot more besides. It is easy to forget that 'lot more.'" The title is intentionally provocative and the article is one of the best I have read on the value and purpose of college education, and it reminded me of the abstract of one of the most influential papers in my field of study, control theory. The title of the paper is "Guaranteed Margins of LQG Regulators," and the abstract states: "There are none."

Finalists Selected for the position of Vice President for Research: After a nationwide search, I am pleased to announce the selection of five finalists for the position of Vice President for Research. An announcement with the names and visit dates of the finalists will be sent out through a separate All-Fac email announcement. Dean Coonrod and the search committee have done an excellent job identifying these finalists from a broad pool of candidates, including over 50 applicants and nine semi-finalists who participated in Skype interviews. I look forward to the campus visits of the five finalists. Each visit will include an open forum, during which the finalists will speak, and members of the UNM community will have the opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback to the search committee. I encourage you to attend these important events. Information about the candidates, and times and locations for their visits and open forums, will be posted as available on the search website.

Data to Knowledge Day: The Office of the Vice President for Research and the Office of the Chief Information Officer invite you to submit presentations for UNM's Data to Knowledge (D2K) Day by the end of this week. The event will be held on February 20.
