# The Acting Provost's Weekly Brief

# April 13, 2017

Good morning! I hope your week is going well. President Abdallah addressed the budget situation in his "Weekly Perspective" on Monday. As he indicated, the budget process is delayed until the governor and legislature agree on the final state appropriation. Perhaps one silver lining is that the governor is expected to call a special session soon. This action should bring some finality to the process. Thank you again for your patience and continued focus on the mission as we await the final outcome.

In the short time I've served as acting provost, I have enjoyed working with the very professional faculty and staff members of the provost's office. They are dedicated to their work and have produced significant results for UNM. I want to take this opportunity to recognize some of these individuals who will be taking on new roles next year. Vice Provost Greg Heileman has accepted a position with the University of Kentucky supervising its student success and student affairs operations. Vice President Jozi De Leon has accepted a position as the leader of Cal Poly San Luis Obispo's equity and inclusion division, and Associate Provost Virginia Scharff has decided to begin the retirement process as of this summer. Each of these individuals brings outstanding talents to UNM. They will be sorely missed from their roles. Over the next few weeks, the president and I will be working with a variety of internal and external stakeholder groups to assess these areas and formulate plans for the future.

## **Honors College Dean Search**

Three finalists for the position of dean of the UNM Honors College have been selected for campus visits between April 19-May 4. The candidates are Ken Mulliken, the executive director of the Honors College at Southern Oregon University; Ann Eisenberg, professor of psychology in the Department of Psychology at the University of Texas at San Antonio; and Greg Lanier, director of the Kugelman Honors Program at the University of West Florida. The candidate visits will include open forums, and meetings with campus administrators, faculty, staff, students, and community members.
