## **UNM Day at the State Legislature**

UNM staff, students, and faculty all made a terrific showing at our annual UNM Day at the State Legislature on Monday, Jan. 28. Two UNM faculty members were honored by the Legislature for their outstanding contributions to New Mexico: <a href="Dr. Vanessa Svihla">Dr. Vanessa Svihla</a> (Department of Organization, Information and Learning Sciences in University Libraries) and <a href="Dr. Leslie Strickler">Dr. Leslie Strickler</a> (Department of Pediatrics in the UNM School of Medicine). Four UNM students were similarly honored: <a href="Esteban Abeyta">Esteban Abeyta</a>, a native of Española, is a Biochemistry major doing research on infectious diseases, a Goldwater Scholar, and a 2019 Churchill Scholar. <a href="Lauren Zundel">Lauren Zundel</a> is a Physics/Math major working in theoretical nanophotonics and a 2018 Goldwater Scholar. <a href="Sumit Patel">Sumit Patel</a> (from Gallup) and <a href="Jaron Kee">Jaron Kee</a> (from Crystal on the Navajo Nation) are fourth-year medical students who have been inducted into the Gold Humanism Honor Society in recognition of their compassionate patient care.

More broadly, a large number of UNM folks showed up to represent UNM at the Roundhouse and brought energy and spirit there. On behalf of the University, thanks to all who gave UNM such a fun and interesting presence via some 30 display tables (and welcoming faces behind them) from main campus, HSC, and the branches.
